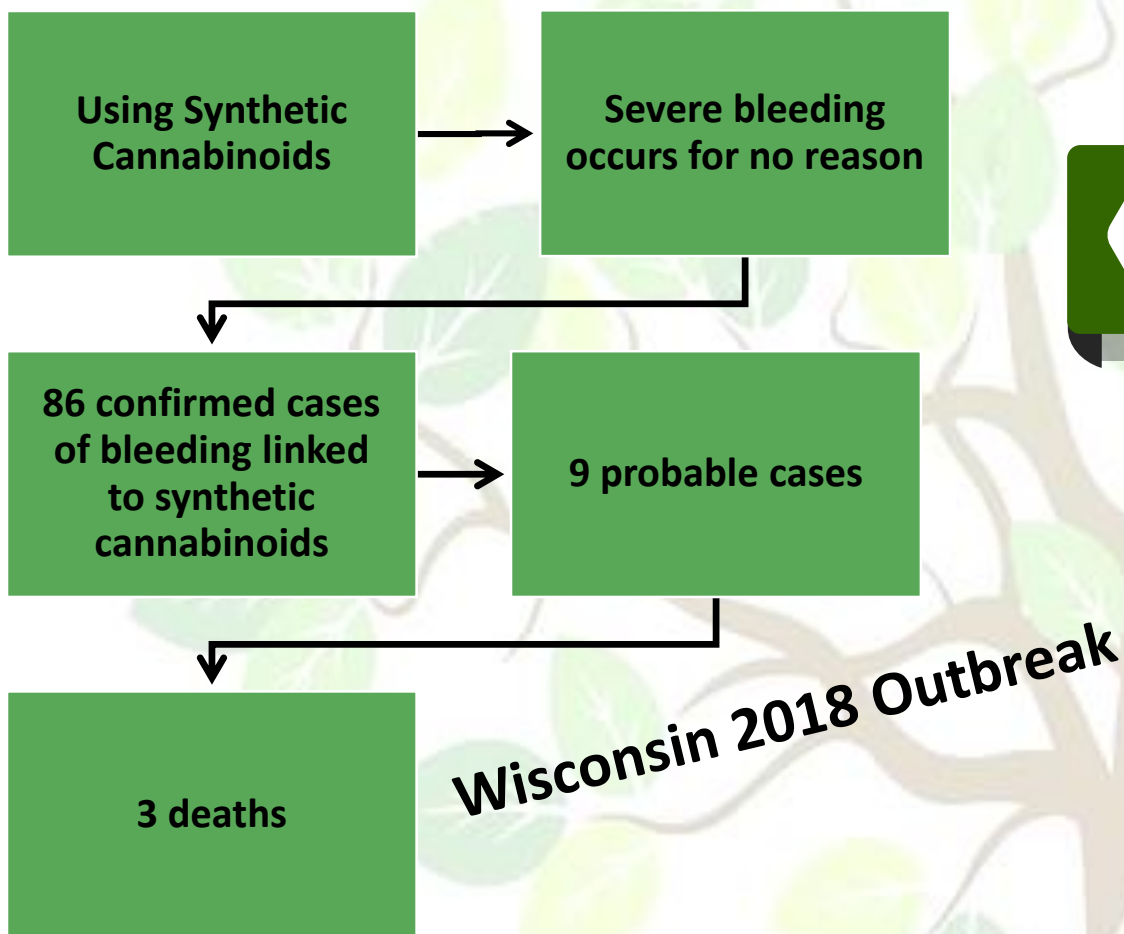


# Alcohol and Drug Abuse

The use of alcohol and other drugs (illegal substance, misuse of prescription drugs, over-the-counter drugs, etc.) that results in negative consequences.

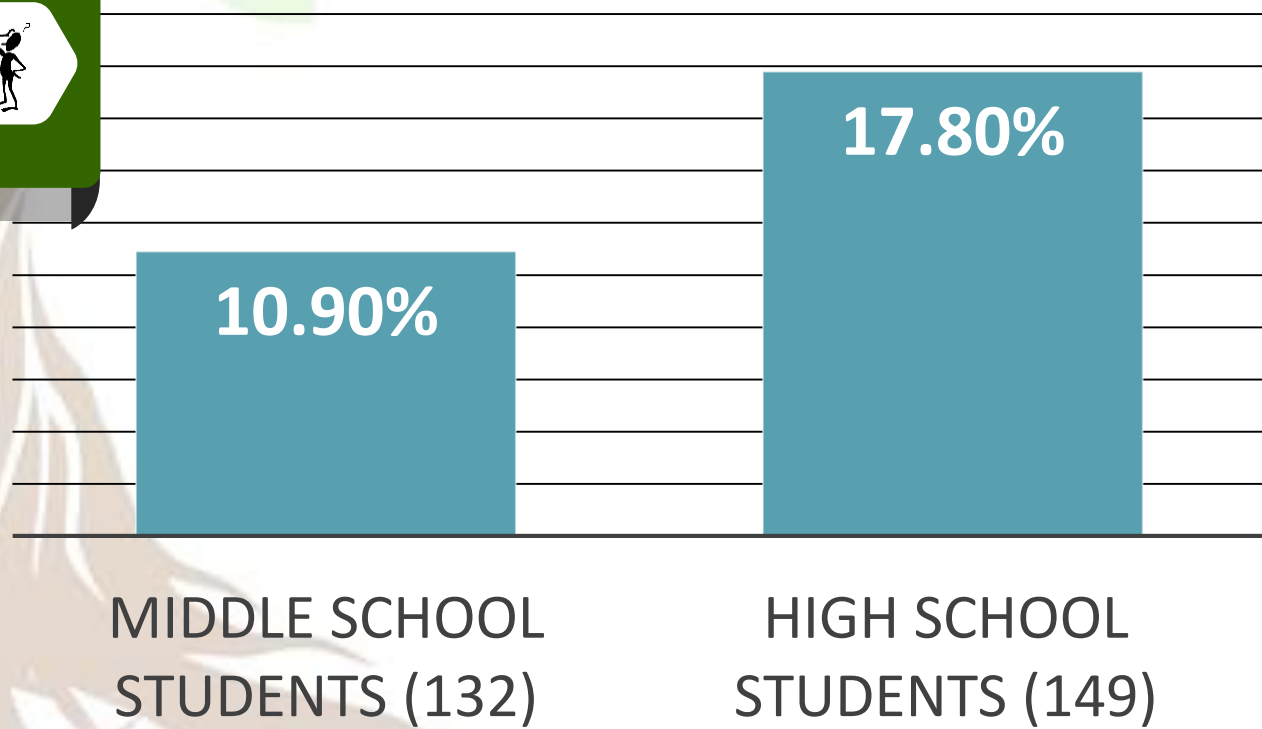
Number of Students who have tried Marijuana in Burnett County, 2018

<u>2016</u>	47	55



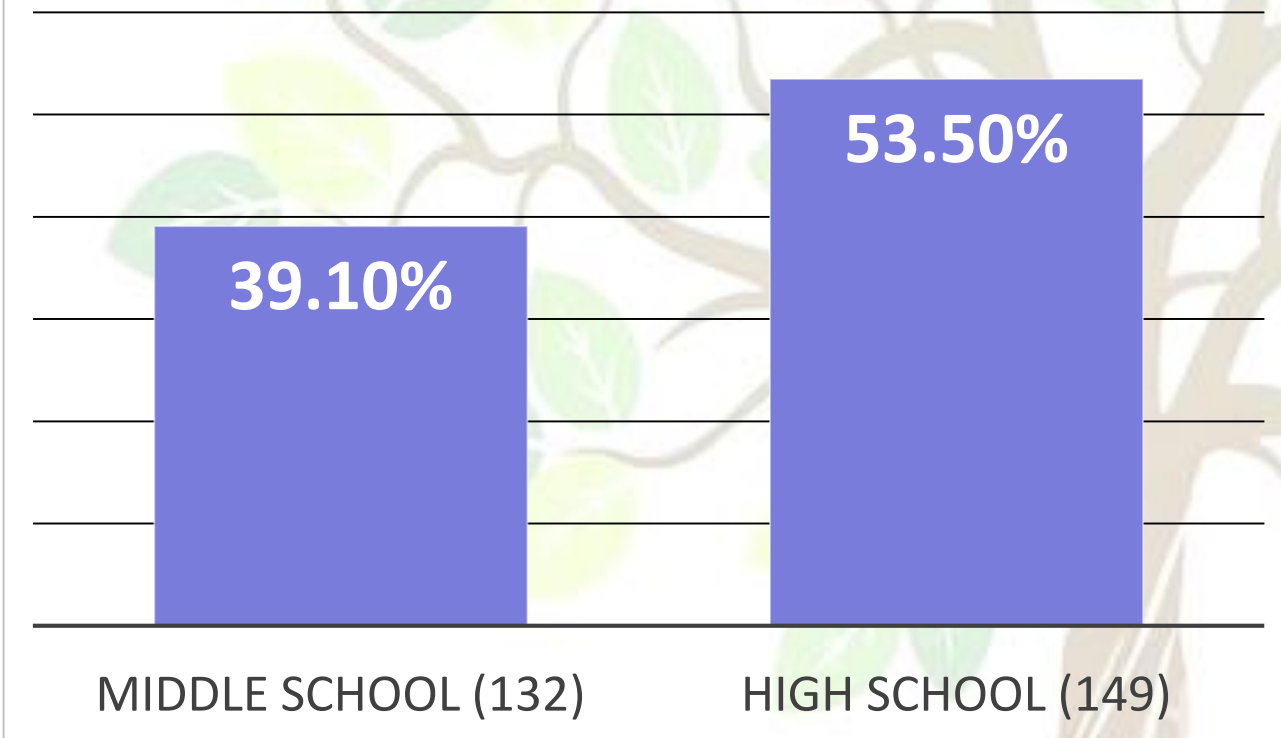
## Community Health Survey

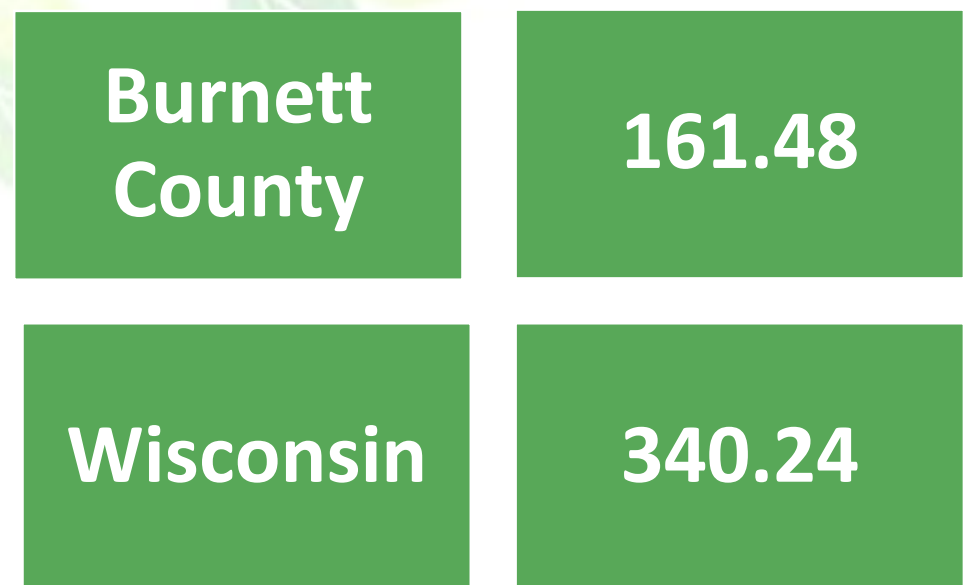

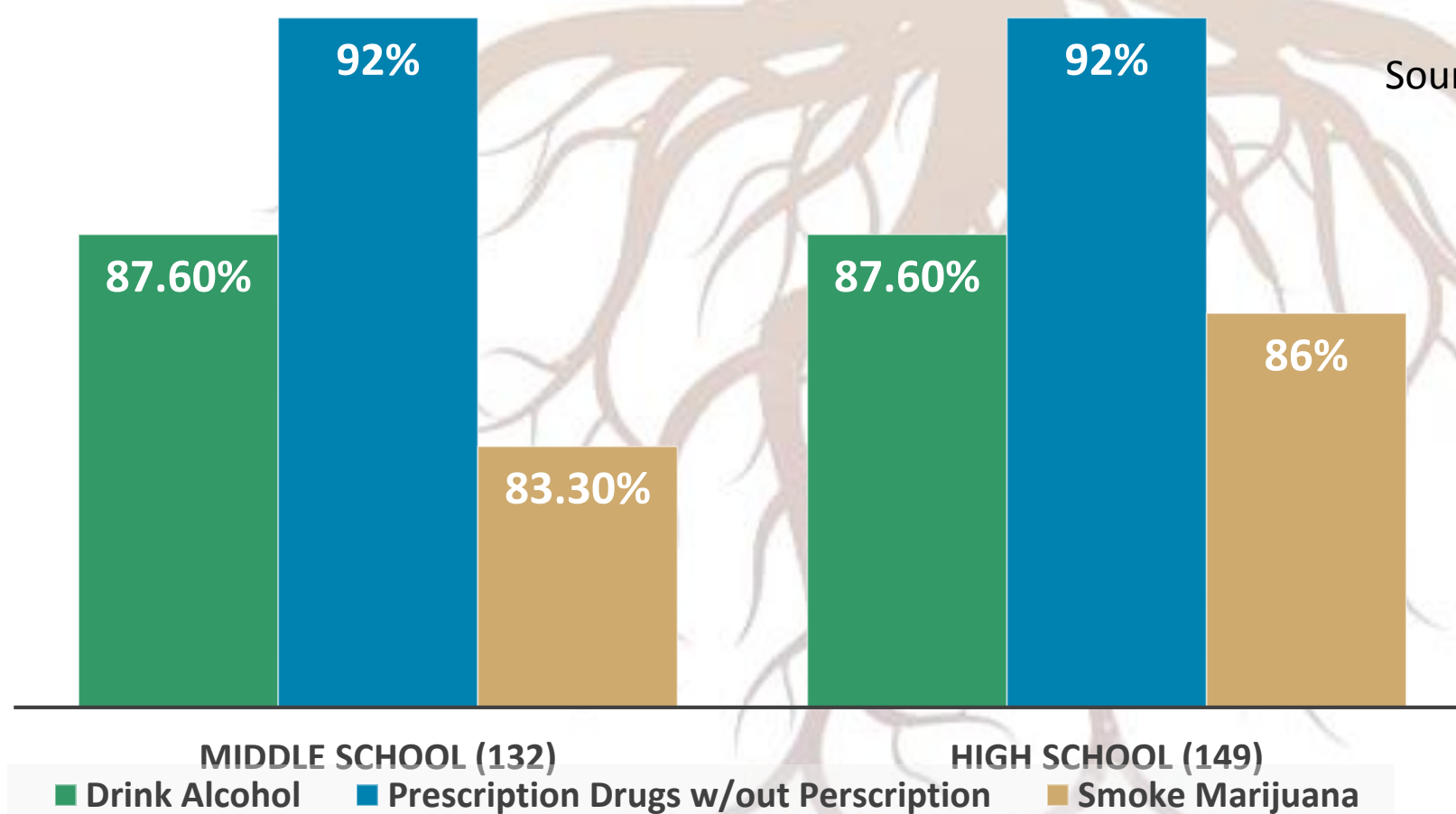
Number of Residents Per Liquor License, 2016

## Existing Assets and Resources in Burnett County Related to Alcohol and Drug Use

### **Burnett County Prevention Coalition**

- Established in 2008 to address the issue of substance abuse among our youth. Working to increase community awareness of issues related to underage drinking and driving in Burnett County.

### **Drug and Alcohol Court**

- Mission is to reduce substance abuse and criminal behavior in order to improve the lives for offenders, families, and the community by providing intensive court supervision, drug testing, and substance abuse treatment.

### **Intoxicated Driver Intervention Program**

- Clients are given the opportunity to change their behavior, while gaining education related to impaired driving. Designed for clients with two or more OWI offenses. Overall goal is to reduce the likelihood of future offenses and to provide clients with an increased awareness of impaired driving.

### **Restorative Justice**

- A community-based response to crime that invites those affected, the victim, the community, and the offender to address the full impact of the crime and ways to repair them.

### **New Beginnings Alano Club**

- AA and NA meetings located in Siren.
- Host Leisure Lake Camp Out, Serenity Under the Stars in Spooner

### **Whole Life Services**

- Offer services to reduce substance use challenges located in Spooner and Siren.

### **St. Croix Tribal Aftercare Program**

- Peer recovery support at St. Croix Tribal Center located in Webster

### **Migizii Miigwam Talking Circle**

- Support group open to anyone
  - Danbury – First and second Monday of the month
  - Sand Lake – First and second Tuesday of the month
  - Maple Plain – Third and fourth Monday of the month
  - Round Lake – Third and fourth Tuesday of the month
